Monetary support and awareness should be our goal. Many have no idea that the Episcopal Church has this fund, but the Relief and Development Fund is there to help.



Concerns for our Sapulpa Community

The latest community event was the Back to School Bash. This event gives out school supplies to students within our community and is growing each year that it is held. This year the church has 12 volunteers and 700 to 800 students. Merchandise was provided by donations 2000 pencils and a single purchase for markers/pencils.

Financial Management and Sustainability Report

Review of the 2024 Annual Audit reviewed. Changes in this procedure will start to be implemented in conjunction with the dioceses Manual of Business Methods in Church Affairs. A new part of the annual audit will include a Statement of Cash Flows that will show the cash flow from the beginning of 2023 to its end. One of the things that was identified in the audit was the listed assets were never depreciated in value. This in turn causes property value to be overstated. A CPA has been consulted to correct this and moving forward current assets will be valued appropriately. Consultation with CPA will also be needed for a capitalization policy.

A review of listed property done ranging from when it was added to the property sheet and the assigned value. The conclusion from this is that the value was incorrect. Also, with the updates to the Manual of Business Methods some property can be removed due to its lack of value.

Review of Income and Expenses Statement, July's Balance Sheet, and Budget Comparison done with the group.

Senior Warden's Report / Concerns / Comments

Presentation of ordering poinsettias given. Review of choices offered by the New Leaf company. An agreement for ordering the 8" flower for Christmas was made.

Junior Warden's Report / Concerns / Comments

Dioceses has sent out a roofing repair company to conduct inspection of damage to roof, building, and AC units from hailstorm damage. This will be the second inspection done for repair. The inspector found more damage than the first inspector that included damage not only to the roof, HVAC, but some of the stained-glass fixtures. Report of this inspection was not available at the time of this meeting but expected soon.

Repair to the parlor air conditioning unit voted on and to use the first bid contractor, JC Mechanical. Since it is under \$3K no dioceses' involvement is needed. This is repair to the evaporator unit and is needed immediately since the unit is leaking. During this vote it should be noted that this contractor chosen works on Sundays. This is favorable to the group since the contractor that was sent by the Diocese does not.

Individual Vestry Member's Reports / Concerns / Comments

A list to explain financial issues will be drafted for the Bishop and will be discussed to draft prior to visit. @Roman Shelton. Another meeting with the vestry group and Bishop will be conducted in September.


